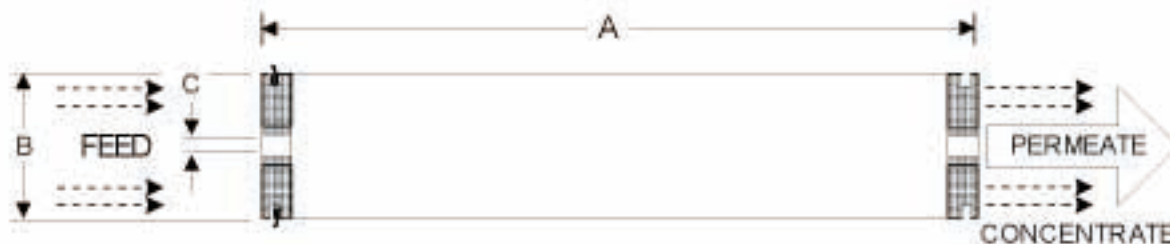

Notice: Permeate flow for individual elements may vary +25% or -15%. Membrane active area may vary +1-4%. All membrane elements are supplied with a brine seal, interconnector, and o-rings. Elements are enclosed in a sealed polyethylene bag containing less than 1.0% sodium meta-bisulfite solution, and then packaged in a cardboard box.
